Location and Facilities

Situated in the town center of Tsuen Wan, the School is in the vicinity of Tsuen Wan and Tsuen Wan West MTR stations. All standard classrooms, special rooms and the School Hall are air-conditioned and well-equipped with Wi-Fi network, computers and other audio-visual equipment. In addition to the 28 air-conditioned classrooms, there are the School Hall, Lecture Room, Multipurpose Student Activity Centre, STEM Centre, Eco Fitness Centre, CLP Room, Computer Assisted

Learning Centre, four laboratories, Geography Room, Music Room, Language Room, Home Economics Room, Art Room, Design and Technology Room, Library and Conference Room. There is also a garden and a podium flowerbed planted with flowers and trees, as well as a basketball court and a badminton court, which offer students ample room for relaxation in a joyful learning atmosphere.

Medium of Instruction

The School places great emphasis on students' language learning. All English and Putonghua teachers have attained the Language Proficiency Requirement (LPR). As English is adopted as the medium of instruction, all subjects, except Chinese language, Chinese History, Life and Society, Citizenship and Social Development and Putonghua, are taught in English.



Teaching Team and Curriculum

Competent Teaching Staff

The School has a team of devoted teachers, all of whom are degree holders and 64% are holders of a Master's degree or above. Every year the School participates in partnership programmes organised by the EDB or local universities. To keep abreast of the times, our teaching

staff also actively participate in professional exchange and sharing activities to stay current with the global education trends and local education development.



School Curriculum


The School has a total of 24 classes, four in each year level of S1-S6.

In the Senior Secondary Curriculum, students are required to study four core subjects, namely English language, Chinese language, Mathematics and Citizenship and Social Development, plus three elective subjects to be chosen from the following 13 elective choices the School offers. To enrich students' learning experiences, Other Learning Experiences (OLE) are offered to senior form students, and a variety of training sessions and workshops are tailor-made for our students, covering topics like drama training, social etiquette, self-grooming and self-image, interview skills, mindfulness and Nagomi Arts, for the sake of their balanced and whole-person development.

Prioritising Learning and Teaching Promoting Quality Education

The efficacy of teaching and learning is always in the forefront of the School's development plan, which is well crafted to improve students' learning strategies and strengthen teachers' professional development.

The School has been actively promoting a Selfregulated Learning Approach so as to create a proactive learning school ambience. For example, not only do students have to write a Chinese essay



weekly and learn via the "Classical Chinese Self-learning App" at their own pace, they are also encouraged to take the initiative to visit the afterschool "Mathematics Self-learning Centre" for their self-improvement. Besides, e-learning has been introduced in all subjects for students to conduct self-regulated learning on different online platforms. Collaborative learning is also promoted through research projects and in-class group work in different subjects, which add greater flexibility and more fun to students' learning experiences. In addition, the School has introduced the Lunchtime Reading Periods organised by the Promotion of Reading Team to help students develop a regular reading habit and promote a good reading culture at school.





In order to raise teaching quality and strengthen teachers' professional development, teaching staff are encouraged to take part in Peer Observation and Collaborative Teaching for their cross-fertilisation. Teachers of different subjects are often invited to share their experiences in collaborative learning and catering for learner diversity. On top of that,



the School is an active member of various external collaborative schemes, such as the EDB School-based Support Services, the Chinese University of Hong Kong Quality School Improvement Project and different Joint-Government School Learning Circles, all of which serve to keep teachers abreast of the latest development in the field of education.



Enhancing IT Education, **Nurturing Multidisciplinary Skills with STEM**

To well equip students for the ever-changing society, the School attaches great importance to Mathematics, Science, Innovation and Technology Education. A school-based STEM education curriculum is tailor-made for junior form students to facilitate their cross-disciplinary learning. For example, to kindle students' passion for science, the "'Gonna Fly Now' Glider Model Competition", "Rocket Car Fun Day" and "Mobile Phone Microscope" project competition were held. The "Flipped Classroom" has also been put into practice for students to learn abstract concepts and complex theories with the aid of tablet apps and 3D printers. While AI has



been introduced in the junior CS curriculum, a variety of enrichment courses for enhancing students' problemsolving and creative thinking skills are offered in the senior secondary levels. For instance, "Forensic Science: Chemistry Elite Training Course", and the training courses for the Hong Kong Mathematics and Science Olympiads and the Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics were held. All of them serve to deepen students' understanding of advanced subject knowledge.

In terms of hardware, the 1 Gbps Internet connection on campus fully supports students' individualised technologybased learning. With the interactive electronic whiteboard installed in specific special rooms, teachers can better interact with students and make their learning more enjoyable. Besides, the School has set up the "STEM Learning Commons", a learning center which provides cutting-edge equipment such as 3D printers, robot kits, microcomputers and sensors for students to learn through hands-on experience of assembling and programming based on the self-regulated learning and creative problem-solving programmes designed by teachers. In the AI Innovation Lab, students can also B 8 0 put their innovative ideas into practice using different kinds of computer software and programmes. All these nurture students to be lifelong learners in

Cultivating Competent Trilingual Communicators

Our School puts great emphasis on students' trilingual proficiency. Apart from the school-based junior form Chinese curriculum, the Chinese Department also offers students a wealth of Putonghua co-curricular activities every year. Besides, to create a quality English learning

environment for students, the School has an effective English curriculum and a wide range of multi-faceted extra-curricular activities which aim to raise students' interest in English learning and to strengthen their four macro skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. In the junior form curriculum, the Language Arts module has been introduced to consolidate students' English foundation through poetry writing, film appreciation and short stories reading circles. Moreover, all S1 freshmen are required to attend a Summer Bridging Programme so that they can quickly adapt to the English learning environment.











The School also provides students with a multitude of English activities, including the regular ones like the "English" Speaking Award Scheme", "English Week" and "TWGSS' Got Talent". The "English Bulletin" with a collection of outstanding work written by students is also published every year. Our students are equally active in external competitions, such as the Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, Joint-Government Secondary School English Debating Competition and English Drama Fest, Such a wide variety of English activities offers students so many ways of learning English that they must be able to identify one that suits their learning style. To further promote the use of English on campus, the morning announcements and assemblies are conducted in English, and the Lunchtime Speaking Periods bring junior and senior students together for speaking practice on a school campus that is decorated with English words of wisdom. Students are fully and truly immersed in an authentic English speaking environment which maximises their exposure to English in everyday life.

Catering for Learner Diversity



As students' academic performance tops the School's list of concern, not only are there regular reviews on the examination results of all subjects, there are also concrete measures for improvement to address different learning needs of high and low achievers. To unleash the talent of top-notch students, the School has utilized the EDB's Diversity Learning Grant to run a series of elite programmes for high flyers in different areas, all of which are conducted by professional instructors and aim to maximise high-achieving students' exposure. The school has

nominated a lot of students to join external gifted programmes organised by the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education such as leadership speech, virtual reality and English literature programmes, and competitions like the Hong Kong Secondary School Coding Challenge, Hong Kong Secondary School Health Exhibition Presentation Competition (CUHK), Asia International Mathematical Olympiad and Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics. In order to take care of the individual differences of students, for Chinese, English and Mathematics classes in junior forms, students are streamed into different ability groups to enhance the effectiveness of learning and teaching. A whole school approach is adopted to provide appropriate support for students with special learning needs. Through effective school-based counselling strategies, including group

learning activities and individual learning programmes, students receive considerable support to enhance their academic performance as well as social and emotional management skills. The School has also set up the Tutorial Classes Team and Peer Learning Groups, which recruit senior form students to tutor junior ones in small groups after school so that students in need can receive individualised attention and timely academic support.









Whole-person Development Nourished with Care and Love

For students' whole-person development, the School actively promotes a caring culture so as to provide better guidance and support throughout students' journey of growth and to develop their positive attitude towards life. The School organises activities such as the "Inter-class Punctuality Competition", "TWGSS Big Clean-up Day" and training camps to develop students' self-discipline and self-management skills. To inculcate positive values in them, there are activities like "Secret Angels" to promote mutual care and peer support. The S6 Power Up Day is also organized to help S6 students to acquire techniques to relieve their pressure. In addition, the S1 adaptation programmes are held to strengthen students' sense of belonging to the school and

help them develop closer relationships with each other. The Inter-class Adventure-

based Competition, Outward Bound Camps, "Sunshine Every Teen Scheme" and Merit Award Scheme are also in place to boost students' self-esteem and confidence. Besides, a host of cultural activities are organized regularly to foster students' aesthetic development and to develop their creativity and art appreciation skills. With a view to

encouraging students to explore the world of work and helping them set their study and career goals, the Career and Life Planning Team organises the TWGSS Careers Expo every year as well as company visits and careers talks regularly. As values education plays a crucial role in students' whole-person development, different service learning activities are organized to cultivate students' spirit of

caring for the community and other virtues like empathy, responsibility and perseverance. Moreover, the Junior Police Call, Red Cross and Community Youth Club offer plenty of opportunities to students to help the needy in society. The TWGSS Elder Academy has also been set up to foster students' community spirit and promote intergenerational harmony.



Through different programmes and activities, the School aims to foster students' wholeperson development so that they can give full play to their potential, boost their wellbeing and cultivate positive values and attitudes. The School is hence best known for its ethos of simplicity and humility, which is grounded in students and teachers' mutual respect and the strong bonds and support among students.







Balanced Development beyond the Classroom



The great variety of extra-curricular activities embodies the School's teaching philosophy of nurturing students' multiple talents and abilities. A total of 27 extra-curricular clubs and societies fall into four categories, namely service and uniform teams, interest clubs, academic clubs and school teams. Through planning and organising activities, students can fully develop their intellectuality and benefit from interaction and collaboration with their peers. Every year, the Students' Association Election and the Joint-Government School Exchange Programme serve to enlarge participating students' social circle and to develop their leadership. As students' all-round, balanced development of multiple talents is the School's prime concern, diversified activities are arranged

to promote their physical, aesthetic and musical development. For example, different sports teams have been established and the "Aesthetic and Physical Development Scheme" has been launched to encourage

S1 students to take part in a kind of sport or music training. The frequent public performances given by the School's Symphonic Band, Chinese Orchestra and String Ensemble are also invaluable opportunities for students to showcase their talents and add a colourful dimension to their school life.









Global Vision beyond the Bounds











In the spirit of life-wide learning, the School always encourages students to step out of the classroom and go outside Hong Kong to widen their worldview for their self-discovery and better self-understanding. Every year, the National and Civic Education Team and Student



Exchange Team organise a number of Mainland and overseas exchange programmes, bringing students to Mainland cities such as Beijing, Shanghai, Xian, Nanjing, Suzhou, Jiangxi and Guangzhou, as well as the United Kingdom, Singapore, Malaysia, Taiwan, Japan and Korea. The School and its two sister schools in Zhangjiagang and Jiaxing also visit each other and have professional exchanges regularly. Students can learn beyond the book through cultural exchange and enrich their life experiences, which paves the way for their future pursuits.







Passion for Four Houses across Generations



Home-school Cooperation for the Way Forward



Parents, who are valued as one of the School's key stakeholders, have been working closely with the School for students' personal growth. The Parents-Teachers' Association oftentimes organises different networking activities, such as the PTA Christmas Party, Games Day, PTA Picnic and interest classes in order to strengthen home-school ties. Such a strong culture of home-school cooperation can be best illustrated by parents' voluntary engagement in school projects like the Lunchtime Reading Periods, School Uniform Recycling Campaign and Green School Parent Participation Scheme. To empower parents to foster the healthy development of their children by understanding them better, the PTA also actively organises different thematic talks and workshops on effective parenting. Effective home-school communication is also fortified through the Parents' Day, S1 Orientation Day, S3 Subject Selection Talk and Talk on Multiple Pathways for Senior Secondary School Students, Besides, every year the PTA donates a generous sum of money to set up scholarships for outstanding students, in addition to its financial support for various school activities, out of sheer parental love to walk with their children through the journey of growth.

TWGSS alumni are important pillars of society and many of them are outstanding leaders in different sectors. • 位置及設施

本校位處荃灣市中心,可徒步直達鄰近的荃灣及荃灣西港鐵站。校內設備完善,標準課室、特別室及禮堂均設空調系統,並配備無線寬頻網絡、電腦等生活動中心、STEM 研習中心、生涯規劃中心、電腦輔助學習中心、實驗室、地理室、音樂室、語言室、家政室、美術室、設計與科技室、圖書館及會議室。另外,本校設有花園、種滿花花園、和北西、羽毛球場及籃球場,讓學生在一個愉快輕鬆的環境下學習。

• 教學語言

本校十分注重學生的語文學習。所有英語教師及普通話教師均已通過基準評核。自創校至今,本校一直以英語為主要教學語言。除中國語文、中國歷史、普通話、生活與社會及公民與社會發展科外,各科目均採用全英語授課。

• 優良師資

我校師資優良,所有老師均持大學學位,六成四老師 具碩士或以上學歷。本校每年均參加本地大學或教育 局舉辦的合作計劃,老師團隊亦參加各類專業交流及 經驗分享活動,對國際教育趨勢及本地教育改革保持 敏鋭觸覺,致力提升教師專業,與時並進。

• 均衡課程

中一至中六級各設四班,全校合共二十四班。 高中課程方面,除了4個必修科目(英國語文、中國語文、數學、公民與社會發展),學生可於本校開設的13個選修科目中選讀三科。此外,為了豐富學生的學習經驗,高中開設「其他學習經歷」課程,讓學生舒展身心,教導學生戲劇表演、社交禮儀、儀容護理及形象指導、面試技巧、靜觀及和諧粉彩等專題,以促進多元智能的發展。 選修科目:

● 優質教育 追求卓越

教學方面,本校以提升學與教效 能為重點發展項目,重視學生的 學習策略與老師的專業發展。



本校積極發展「自主學習」策略,營造積極自主的 學習氛圍,例如中文科設常規課業「每周一文」及 「文言自學 App」、數學科設「課後自學中心」: 又推行電子化學習,各科均 使用電子化平台輔助學習。 協作學習方面,各科均有不

同的專題研習及課堂分組活動,使學習更靈活、更富趣味。本校亦重視學生的閱讀習慣,除設立「午讀時段」,亦舉辦閱讀小組統籌閱讀活動,以培養校園的閱讀風氣。



• 科技學習 啟迪創新

設備方面,校園設有 1Gbps 的無線網絡,方便學生使用電子學習設備:部分特別室備有電子互動白板,讓學習更靈活有趣。此外,學校設有「STEM研習中心」,備有 3D 打印機、機械人套裝組件、微型電腦和感應器等資源,讓學生動手組裝及編程,進行由老師設計的自主科研探究和創意解難活動,成為科學與科技的終身學習者,以接受二十一世紀的挑戰。

● 兩文三語 善於溝通

為了優化學生的溝通能力,本 校特別著重兩文三語的培育 除了中文科設有「初中校本課 程」,普通話科有豐富的 活動外,學校亦提供優質的英

語學習環境及多元化的活動,以提升學生的學習興趣。課程方面,本校英文科在初中滲入「語文藝術」的元素,如英詩寫作、電影欣賞和短篇故事欣賞,以鞏固學生的英文基礎:並舉辦暑期英語銜接課程,幫助中一新生及早適應以英語學習的環境。

• 全面照顧 提升學習

本校一向關注學生的學業成 績,制定了照顧學習多樣性

的策略。拔尖方面,學校申請了「多元學習津貼」, 開設一系列的拔尖課程,由專業導師任教,供不 同範疇中表現優異的學生參加。本校又推薦學生 參與校外的資優課程和比賽,包括香港資優教育 學苑舉辦的領袖演講、虛擬實境、英國文學等課 程、全港中學編程挑戰賽、香港中學健康展覽報 告比賽(香港中文大學)、亞洲國際數學奧林匹克比 賽、香港電腦奧林匹克競賽等,協助學生發展潛能。 為照顧學生個別差異,初中在中、英、數三科按能 力分組上課,加強學與教效能,並以全校參與模式, 為有特殊學習需要的學生提供適切的支援。透過制 定有效的校本輔導策略,包括小組學習活動和個人 學習計劃,提升學生的學術成績,和社交及情緒管 理能力。又設「學業指導計劃」和「朋輩學習小組」・ 由高年級學長擔任指導員,以小組形式,於課後指 導初中學弟學妹完成功課、協助溫習。

• 重視德育 全人發展

為照顧學生的全人發展,本校著重推廣德育及關愛文化,在學生的成長路上予以扶持和指引。學校設有「班際守時比賽」、「荃官洗白





十字會和公益少年團設有不同的 服務學習活動,培養學生成為長 饋社會的良好公民。「荃官更多 學苑」的設立亦讓學生有更多機 會與長者交流,促進彼此了解, 達致長幼共融,培養學生的公民 及社區參與意識。

● 多元活動 盡展潛能

多姿多彩的課外活動,充分體現本校著重多元智能的教學宗旨。本校的課外活動學會共27多個,以啟迪學生知性和群性的發展。此外,每年的「學生會」選舉和「聯校交換生計劃」,都能讓學生培育領導才能,擴闊社交圈子。在體藝和音樂方面,本校重視不同才能的均衡發展,除了各項目的校隊,



● 境外交流 拓闊視野

本校鼓勵學生走出課<mark>室,放眼世界,親身到海外遊歷,發展個人潛能。「國民及公民教育組」及「學生交流組」每年籌辦多項國內及海外學生交流計劃,學生足跡遍及國內各大城市,包括北京、上海、西安、南京、蘇州、江西和廣州等:海外則踏足英國、星加坡、馬來西亞、台灣、日本及韓國。本校現時有兩間分別位於張家港及嘉興的姊妹學校,並會定期互訪和進行專業交流。</mark>

• 四社文化 薪火相傳


